3.	PASS RESOLUTIONS to transition to carbon neutrality and zero waste by 2030.	This includes carbon neutrality and zero waste for all Council- controlled organisations.  Start with preparation for the 2020 annual plan which will be notified for submission about May 2020.
		Need new 10 year long term plan approved in 2021, section 93 allows a long-term plan to be amended, so can update the 2018-2028 long term plan as necessary before the 2021-2031 long term plan finalised.
		Tell Council-controlled companies of expectation that their annual statements of intent must show a commitment to carbon neutrality, zero waste, and community consultation as part of exhibiting a sense of social and environmental responsibility.
		[Council companies need to produce a draft statement of intent each year for Council comment by 1 March each year; see Schedule 8 of the Local Government Act 2002.]

Far North District Council is intending to join this appeal. It needs to stay involved throughout the appeal process.  Depending on who gets elected to Northland Regional Council,	
		there might be the votes to reverse the decision to not have rules about GMOs in the Regional Plan.

		Actions which could address this social and environmental responsibility requirement include: transition to carbon neutrality, zero waste, not exploiting communities for profit, local infrastructure provision, supporting local businesses not competing with them, good design standards, and adopting environmental measures such as improving water quality. Also consider paying dividends direct to communities, and ensuring gender/ethnic/age balance on Boards of Directors.
		This is too big an exercise for completion by the end of 2019; although some direction could be provided by then for the 2020 Statements of Intent.
		Therefore aim for big changes in objectives for Council- controlled organisations in the 2021 Statements of Intent and in the 2021-2031 Long Term Plan.

New Long Term Plans for the Far North District Council and the Northland Regional Council will need to be approved in 2021, providing an opportunity to have a ten year plan in place before the next local government election that commits to carbon neutrality, zero waste, inclusive processes, etc.

NAME OF NRC consider changing to reflect the role of environmental governance eg "Environment Tai Tokerau	The current name doesn't represent what the council is responsible for and lacks a connection to the land and people.  However changing the name will be at a cost, as it would require changes to letterheads, web pages, vehicle branding and so on.
		So need to assess the cost of a name change and consult with the community on it.
